## Answers

**1. A) True**

The new law aims to reduce the exposure of minors to high levels of toxic second hand smoke. The latest statistics from the Environmental Protection Agency show 11% of children in the US age 6 and under are exposed to secondhand smoke in their homes 4 or more times a week. That's about 3 million children!

**2. C) 30%**

That's about 75,000 children! In Tulare County, 23% or 29,000 children were diagnosed with asthma and Madera County had 22% which figures out to 9000 children.

**3. D) All of the above**

When it comes to food, hot dogs, nuts and seeds, chunks of meat or cheese, hard, gooey or sticky candy, popcorn, chunks of peanut butter, raw vegetables, whole grapes, fruit chunks such as apple chunks or chewing gum are considered a choking hazard.
